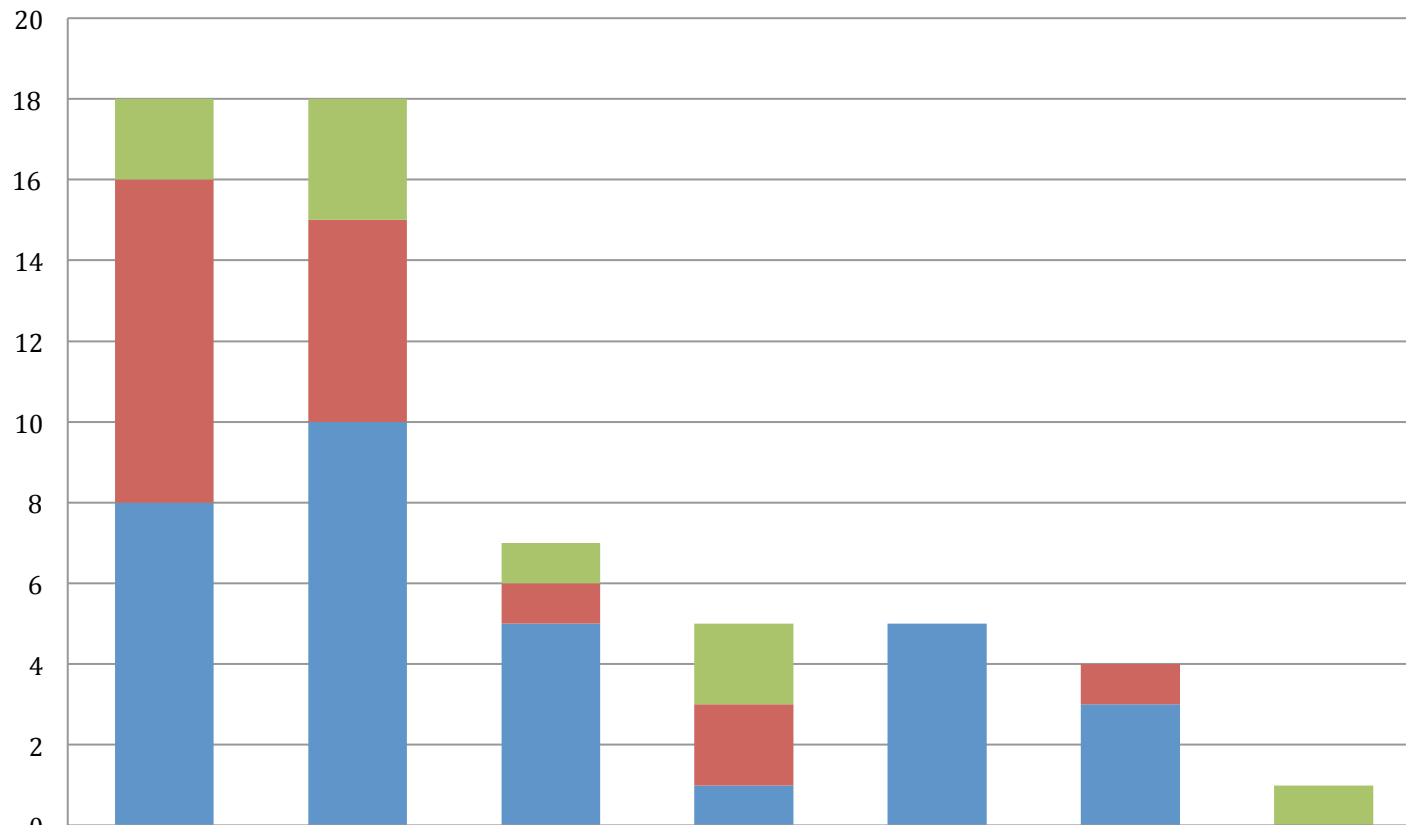


**Figure 2: Three Genres of Storytelling in Relation to Methodological Standpoints**
