



WHO ARE THE POLITICAL .01%?

The richest 1% control about one-third of America's net worth. But just 0.01% contribute 25% of the money to all federal political campaigns.





Embodied Restorying with Horses

One of two programs we are doing in New Mexico

EMBODIED RESTORYING PROCESS

- 1. Recharacterize (authentic Self identity) Story that is ideal when you were at your best
- 2. Externalize (re-label) Make the character in old story the Problem, not the person
- 3. Sympathize (benefits) of old story
- 4. Revise (consequences) of old story
- 5. Strategize (Little Wow Moments of exception to grand old story)
- 6. Restory (rehistoricizes the Grand old Story by collecting Little Wow moments into New story)
- 7. Publicize (support networking) e.g. letter writing with supporters of New Story



DUMB GRAND NARRATIVE 3 Diagnostic and Statistical Manual

Political, Economic, and Social/Cultural decision on stress		
DSM I	1952	Combat exhaustion
DSM II	1968	Withdrawal of combat exhaustion
DSM III	1980	PTSD finally makes it in after 10 years of protesting.
DSM IV	1994	Expanded to "everything and anything"
DSM V	2013	PTSD restricted to one traumatic event

May 15 2014 - What is Homeless in America? A discussion with US homeless veterans by David Boje, Liz EnglandKennedy, and Febna Carver

Carlos [IN Mexico] "Everybody just sleeps everywhere..."

Carlos -- "The word homeless doesn't exist in Mexico. It's a total/It's a whole/The term, and the reality, and the stigma is an American reality"

Boje – "What do you mean?"

Michael – "... Let me put it this way. If you were to do something like Febna said, build your own small shack on an area of land, they would kick you right off of it cause you don't own the land//... People will buy land and build their own stuff and they'll still try to kick them off, for improper housing, and not being up to housing code, not having electricity, and this, that, and the other thing"

Febna: "Because back home [India] people will take like plant things from the coconut trees. They take some kind of, you know, mud and clay and make their own houses. The poor live like that. In big cities, 'yes' there are homeless. But still, they make huts of tar and plastic sheets, and sleep there. We call them squatters, or slum settlers, but never homeless"

Michael: "It's very few states that allow squatters in the U.S. It's usually illegal..."
