- 2. Provide a one-of-a-kind cutting-edge facility for military personnel (active and retired/veterans) and their families to strengthen and heal themselves through a continuum of traditional and innovative treatment and interactive opportunities with animals and the environment.
- 3. NMSU will be on the forefront of service to our state in a way only NMSU could possibly provide. The College of Agriculture has offered any land in New Mexico for the project, as long as it brings in funding.


